Dear Parents/Guardians and Students,

We received a letter from the HSE, on Monday, sent to all secondary schools in Clonmel and Carrick-on-Suir as follows:

Subject: Covid 19

Dear Principal,

We have received, in the Department of Public Health South East, reports from colleagues around the country of cases of COVID-19 associated with secondary school attendance. There are a few matters (which impact on all students, but are reported to impact particularly on Leaving Certificate students) that I would like to highlight with you:

- Students going to large parties, in particular 18th birthday parties.
- Cases attending schools while symptomatic.
- Close contacts attending school when knowing they are a close contact.
- Leaving Certificate students may feel a need to attend school, despite advice to the contrary, for calculated grades tests.

We have not received similar reports in the South East, and we have had very few cases in secondary school age children since the return to school after Easter. I commend, and thank you and your staff for all your work on this to date. I would appreciate if you would further appeal to students and staff to keep up the good work, in particular emphasising the need for cases, suspect cases, and close contacts to stay out of school for the advised period, and to all students to avoid gathering in large groups, and in particular, indoors.
