## Dear Parents/Guardians,

We are delighted to have everyone back in school where the sense of purpose and of **Love, Laughter and Learning** is restored. We are listening to our staff and students and working together to both maintain routines and create new routines that keep everyone safe.

## Uniform

We are very happy with the level of cooperation that students have shown with wearing the normal uniform or the PE uniform and not “mixing and matching” between the two separate uniforms and not substituting leggings for the tracksuit end. This trial will continue next week as a result.

## Social Distancing

We would like to ask parents/guardians to discuss the importance of 2m social distancing with their children. This is what is expected of students during break time and lunch time (whether inside or outside).

## Additional Activities

**Cooperation by our students with all current school routines, including the 2m social distancing at break time and lunch time, will be the determining factor for any new activities to be added to the school day. So, each student has personal responsibility for its success.**

## Afternoon Study

Our 6<sup>th</sup> Years have cooperated very well with all routines put in place to date to ensure the safety of all in the community. As a result, we have already informed 6<sup>th</sup> years and their parents/guardians that from next Monday 5<sup>th</sup> October we are trialling Afternoon Study with 6<sup>th</sup> years.

Once we have a **brief trial period completed** and depending on the level of cooperation from other year groups regarding 2m social distancing at break time and lunch time, we may extend this trial for other year groups. *This will also depend on the availability of supervisors, as study centres have smaller numbers this year.* We hope to let parents/guardians know more about this by the end of next week.

How to use  
**Face Coverings**

ALWAYS CLEAN YOUR HANDS BEFORE AND AFTER WEARING A FACE COVERING

**Correct Covering**

Medical masks should be reserved for health workers or patients in treatment. If you have been advised to wear a medical mask, always have the secured side covering and the metal band at the top of your nose.

**Check Your Fit**

Check that the face covering is made from a fabric that you are comfortable wearing.

Check that it is easy to fit and completely covers your nose and mouth. If the way doesn't under your chin.

Tighten the bands or ties so it's snug around your face, without gaps. If there are strings, tie them tight. Go over the head to get a snug fit. Do not touch or adjust while the face covering when it's on.

**DO NOT:** Wear the face covering below your nose.

**DO NOT:** Leave your chin exposed.

**DO NOT:** Wear it loosely with gaps on the sides.

**DO NOT:** Wear it so it covers just the top of your nose.

**DO NOT:** Push under your chin.

**FOLLOW THESE TIPS TO STAY SAFE:**

**ALWAYS:** Wash your hands before and after handling and after removing the face covering.

**ALWAYS:** Avoid contact with the covering if it is off your face.

**DO NOT:** Carry a used single-use face covering in your pocket or bag. A reusable bag is a better option.

**ALWAYS:** Carry a second single-use face covering in your pocket or bag. If you need to change, swap it out for a new one.

**ALWAYS:** Avoid touching the face covering when it's on.

**ALWAYS:** Avoid touching your face when you're wearing a face covering.

**Safe Removal**

When you take it off, avoid touching the face covering.

Do not touch the face covering when it's off.

**Disposing Of Single-Use Mask**

Always dispose of single-use masks responsibly in a bin.

Don't forget to clean your hands and face after you've disposed of the mask.

Stay safe. Protect each other.
