**Dear Parents/Guardians,**

Thank you to all our students and their families for their continued support as we settle in to our “*new normal*”.

While we are in *this “new normal”* teaching and learning continues here each day! Your daughter has received a presentation regarding Subject Choice from Guidance Counsellor Ms Williams.

At this time of the year we usually meet First Year parents/guardians regarding Subject Choice. Unfortunately, with Level 3 restrictions we are unable to host a meeting here in school.

However, Ms Williams has recorded a Subject Choice presentation for parents/guardians. Please ask your daughter to show you this recording which has been posted on her First Year Team. This will explain very clearly about subject choice to you and your daughter.

Ms Williams would like to point out that the most important decision is whether or not to keep a modern foreign language, as it is the only decision that could potentially have future consequences. Our recommendation would be that all students would keep a modern foreign language (i.e. French/German) unless they fall into one of the following categories below:

1. A student who has a language other than English/ Irish at home and can speak and write it sufficiently well to sit it as a Leaving Certificate subject, to meet matriculation requirements.
2. A student who has an exemption from Irish and a third language, granted by the Department of Education on the **grounds of a learning difficulty**.
3. A student who does not wish to study a language but is fully aware that by giving up a third language now, this decision may have consequences in the future i.e. failure to meet matriculation requirements for the NUI's.

How to use Face Coverings

ALWAYS CLEAN YOUR HANDS BEFORE AND AFTER WEARING A FACE COVERING

**Correct Covering**

Medical masks should be reserved for health workers or patients in treatment. If you have been advised to wear a medical mask, always have the secured side covering and the metal band at the top of your nose.

**Check Your Fit**

Check that the face covering is made from a fabric that you are comfortable wearing. Check that it is easy to fit and completely covers your nose and mouth. If the nose is always, tie down loops on top of the head to get a good fit. Do not touch or adjust with the face covering when it is on.

**DO NOT:** Wear the face covering below your nose. **DO NOT:** Leave your eyes exposed. **DO NOT:** Wear it loosely with gaps on the sides. **DO NOT:** Wear it so it covers just the top of your nose. **DO NOT:** Push under your chin.

**FOLLOW THESE TIPS TO STAY SAFE:**

- ALWAYS** wash your hands before and after handling your face covering.
- ALWAYS** ensure you have plenty of air circulation.
- DO NOT** touch the front of the face covering.
- DO NOT** touch your face, nose, mouth or eyes.
- DO NOT** touch the front of the face covering.

**Safe Removal**

Do not touch the top loops to take the face covering off. Do not touch the front surface. Take it off.

**Disposing Of Single-Use Mask**

Always dispose of single-use masks responsibly in a bin. Don't forget to clean your hands and face after disposal.
